In 1980 he established the CIBJO diamond grading service at the Laboratory. In 1989, with further grading experience in New York, Eric started the GIA diamond report service in London.



During his career he has had the privilege of examining some of the most famous and largest gems, including the Moghul Emerald, the Cullinan I and Cullinan II, the Koh-i-Noor and the Agra diamonds.
